## Getting Ready for AP US History

This course is designed for the high school student that will be taking AP US History. The class will examine and discuss the assigned summer assignments (*A People's History of the United States* and Mock AP exam). This class is ideal for students moving from college prep into AP and/or the Honors student that wants to be more fully prepared for the rigors of the AP program.

Topics include:

- How to take notes in the college classroom
- Preparing for college level reading assignments
- Primary Source analysis
- What is a DBQ? (Document Based Question) and how do you answer it?
- Constructing a strong thesis statement
- Review the 4 different parts of the AP Exam

## Getting Ready for AP Government

This course is being completely redesigned by the College Board and will model itself much more with the APUSH course. The new curriculum has laid the groundwork for the summer class to feature:

- In depth examination of the Constitution
- Supreme Court case analysis
- Free response writing skills
- linking current events to historical situations
- debate skills

## Getting Ready for AP Chemistry

The AP Chemistry course is developed based on AP Chemistry guidelines for students who are willing to do college-level work during high school. Students should expect to devote sufficient time and energy to complete rigorous coursework—writing and performing laboratory procedures, AP test preparation, scientific vocabulary, extensive calculations, POGIL (Process Oriented Guided Inquiry Learning) assignments, and peer/group discussion activities. For this summer course we will focus on reviewing and applying the first principles of chemistry to explaining physical and chemical phenomena.

## College Essay Writing Course

Students will work on the following, finishing the course with a completed, revised, ready to submit essay for the Common Application:

- The purpose of the application essay
- What admissions officers look for
- Topic selection
- Drafting and the revision process
- Clarity in writing
- Active voice/ interesting topics
- Tone/diction
- Variety in sentence structure
- Common missteps to avoid

Students are encouraged to bring their own laptops. Students will have ample time to work on their essays both through independent work and teacher conference time. In the event that a student does not finish an essay during the course, the teacher will be happy to continue conferencing with them in the Fall until a final draft is completed.

## Getting Ready for AP Language and Composition

The AP English Language course is developed based on AP English language guidelines for students who are willing to do college-level work during high school. Students should expect to devote sufficient time and energy to complete rigorous coursework—reading and discussion assignments, extensive writing, AP test preparation, vocabulary, use of rhetoric, collaborative language arts assignments, and peer/group discussion activities. For this summer course we will focus on the writing formats of the three essays, rhetorical devices and summer reading.

## SAT PREP: Evidence Based Reading and Writing

This course is a comprehensive experience designed to help students prepare for the rigors of taking the PSAT and/or SAT tests offered by College Board. Students will be familiarized with the instructional format, types of questions, and various answers expected for the Critical Reading and Writing aspects of these tests. Although much of the English portion of the PSATs/SATs relate to testing format, content is also essential. Be it grammar, sentence fluency, essay planning, reading strategies, or overall test-taking tips and tricks, knowing how to take the test is paramount when preparing for the PSATs and SATs. Take this course to get ahead of the curve in identifying and implementing the test taking strategies needed to increase performance.

## SAT PREP: Math Concepts

This course is a comprehensive experience designed to help students prepare for the rigors of taking the PSAT and/or SAT tests offered by College Board. Students will be familiarized with the instructional format, types of questions, and various answers expected for the Math aspects of these tests. Although much of the Math portion assesses your understanding of mathematical concepts, your procedural skill and fluency in math, and your ability to apply those concepts and skills to real-world problems, or overall test-taking tips and tricks, knowing how to take the test is paramount when preparing for the PSATs and SATs. Take this course to get ahead of the curve in identifying and implementing the test taking strategies needed to increase performance.
