AP US History Prep Course

This course is designed for the high school student that will be taking Advanced Placement United States History. The class will examine and discuss the summer assignments as well as move into the four part breakdown of the exam that takes place in May of 2020. This is ideal for any student moving from Honors into the AP program, especially if this is their first AP class.

Topics include:

- Time management and organization in an AP class
- Multiple Choice Questions in groupings with primary sources, part one of the exam
- Short Answer guidelines for effectively answering the second section
- Writing the DBQ with an effective thesis and document analysis, the third part of the exam
- Understanding the structure and how to write the final part of the exam, the Long Essay
- An abridged Final Exam will be given within the last day of the class

College Essay Writing Course

Students will work on the following, finishing the course with a completed, revised, ready to submit essay for the Common Application:

- The purpose of the application essay
- What admissions officers look for
- Topic selection
- Drafting and the revision process
- Clarity in writing
- Active voice/ interesting topics
- Tone/diction
- Variety in sentence structure
- Common missteps to avoid

Students are encouraged to bring their own laptops. Students will have ample time to work on their essays both through independent work and teacher conference time. In the event that a student does not finish an essay during the course, the teacher will be happy to continue conferencing with them in the Fall until a final draft is completed.

SAT PREP: Evidence Based Reading and Writing

This course is a comprehensive experience designed to help students prepare for the rigors of taking the PSAT and/or SAT tests offered by College Board. Students will be familiarized with the instructional format, types of questions, and various answers expected for the Critical Reading and Writing aspects of these tests. Although much of the English portion of the PSATs/SATs relate to testing format, content is also essential. Be it grammar, sentence fluency, essay planning, reading strategies, or overall test-taking tips and tricks, knowing how to take the test is paramount when preparing for the PSATs and SATs. Take this course to get ahead of the curve in identifying and implementing the test taking strategies needed to increase performance.

SAT PREP: Math Concepts

This course is a comprehensive experience designed to help students prepare for the rigors of taking the PSAT and/or SAT tests offered by College Board. Students will be familiarized with the instructional format, types of questions, and various answers expected for the Math aspects of these tests. Although much of the Math portion assesses your understanding of mathematical concepts, your procedural skill and fluency in math, and your ability to apply those concepts and skills to real-world problems, or overall test-taking tips and tricks, knowing how to take the test is paramount when preparing for the PSATs and SATs. Take this course to get ahead of the curve in identifying and implementing the test taking strategies needed to increase performance.
