District funds will be utilized to address HVAC needs in our district to mitigate the risk of virus transmission. Through school facility upgrades and improvements, we'll reduce the risk of virus transmission and exposure to environmental health hazards in order to continue schools safe opening of our schools. The district will be prepared to supply masks as needed to staff, students and visitors. Additionally, the district will ensure appropriate cleaning and disinfecting to remove germs on surfaces to reduce any risk of spreading infection with special attention to frequently touched surfaces.

The Plumsted Township School District will utilize data from the summer school remedial program, as well as from district diagnostics and NJ Start Strong Assessments to identify students needing additional support. Students will be identified to receive small group targeted instruction from an appropriately certificated teacher as well as be offered after-school tutoring services through an extended day program and extended school year targeted support in small groups within the greater program and/or one-on-one personalized support.

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Remaining funds will be utilized to address HVAC repairs and issues in our school buildings to mitigate the risk of virus transmission. Funds will also be used to ensure continuity of instruction and programming and staff to support the social and emotional needs to students district wide.
